Greenlawn Farms: Michael Zoitas expects to open market within the month. There will be a good blend of organic and mainstream items with large produce emphasis and bakery, deli, cheese and grocery sections. With nearby Paumanack, they recognize the need for value flyer will advertise 400 specials. Their lease is 20 years, so they are committed to the store and community.

Harborfields Central School District Budget Vote: Diana Todaro, Superintendent of Schools and Assistant Superintendents William Nimmo and Francesco Ianni presented options for budget which will come before voters May 17. Currently, one of the lowest per pupil expenditures, they are considering piercing the tax cap, which would require more than 60% approval and if passed, residents will not receive their tax rebate of \$130 next year. Currently there are between 200 and 225 students per grade with declining enrollment. Residents are encouraged to call Superintendents' Office with questions.

Committee Reports:

Earth Day is April 30. Outreach has arranged for children's activities at Pickle Park. Many groups in Town are expected to participate, along teen volunteers and families. Membership will set up a table at Pickle and Ridley Parks. Looking forward to a great community effort!
